TECHA - Technologies Exploitation for the Cultural Heritage Development is an International event, organized every two years, promoted by the Consiglio Nazionale delle Ricerche - Dipartimento Patrimonio Culturale e ENEA to offer to researchers, companies and local organizations, a common discussion platform on methodological topics, innovations and problems connected to the cultural heritage.

Heritage is today a major asset in the attractiveness of territories. Its economic and social impacts are key elements for the stakeholders (communities, managers, companies), which intervene in heritage diagnosis, preservation, renovation or even valorization.

Moreover, heritage valorization necessitates integrated management that takes into account the cultural, economic and social dimensions of the territories.

Trough a cycle of conferences on the state of the art in heritage innovation, open round table discussions, specific business meetings, a fair where professionals can exhibit their innovative technologies and present their specific competences, TECHA wants to draw the attention on the state of the art and on the innovative trends of scientific research.

Heritage is today a major asset in the attractiveness of territories. Its economic and social impacts are key elements for the stakeholders (communities, managers, companies), which intervene in Heritage diagnosis, preservation, renovation or even valorization.

Following TECHA 2008 in Rome, next September 2010, the CNR, ENEA and Cultural Industries & Heritage Cluster organize the second forum TECHA 2010, in Arles in partnership with the EEN (Enterprise Europe Network) nodes: Bridge Economies, Cinema and Med2Europe.

This edition is focused on conservation and interpretation of the Cultural and Natural Heritage.


# L'innovazione al servizio del patrimonio culturale e naturale

Attraverso conferenze sullo stato dell'arte e le innovazioni tecnologiche per la conservazione e la valorizzazione del patrimonio culturale, tavole rotonde, incontri bilaterali tra ricercatori, imprenditori e rappresentanti delle organizzazioni locali e spazi espositivi, TECHA è l'occasione di incontri e dibattiti nonché vetrina delle migliori tecnologie.

Dopo TECHA 2008, organizzato a Roma, in cui ci si è confrontati su tematiche legate prevalentemente ai beni culturali come analisi, diagnostica e monitoraggio, materiali e tecniche di intervento, ICT e tecnologie sostenibili per il patrimonio culturale, in TECHA 2010 l'attenzione sarà rivolta alle problematiche legate al territorio quali la conservazione e la fruizione del patrimonio naturale e culturale.









## TECHA 2008 in Rome

In 2008, Rome was the venue of the first TECHA event, Technologies Exploitation for the Cultural Heritage Advancement.

This international event focused on the current and future perspectives of technologies linked to the cultural Heritage.

More than 200 participants attended the event during which more than 500 meetings took place between research centers, excellence clusters, works managers, communities, design offices and businesses acting in diagnosis, conservation recommandations, restoration and conservation.

- Information & communication technologies for cultural heritage;

## **TECHA 2010 in Arles**

In 2010, Arles will be devenue of the second edition of TECHA. It will take place in the Grande Halle (Great Hall) of the former railway yard, Landmark of Arles Heritage and symbol of the renovation and valorization of Heritage.

Whilst keeping the axis of the first TECHA the Arles event will focus on themes developed within the Cultural Industries & Heritage Cluster, i.e. built heritage, natural heritage, culture dissemination.

The TECHA conferences are a rare opportunity for professional meetings between the players of the whole decision-making process.

The interventions will make it possible to take stock of:

- the condition of the relationships between the various players in Integrated Heritage Management,
- the needs in terms of innovation of all the players: innovations in equipment, practices, protocols, culture dissemination tools, etc.
- scientific progress in diagnosis, protocols, practice tools and innovative technologies put to the service of the valorization and dissemination of Heritage.




