The Project "Making the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union a Living Instrument"

The Project "Making the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union a Living Instrument", co-funded by the European Commission (JUST/2012/FRAC/AG/2705), seeks to enhance knowledge about the Charter of Fundamental Rights and to promote its effective enforcement at the EU level as well as at the national level.

The Project develops a standardised training curriculum for making legal professionals competent to apply CFR rights in their professional practise, but also to make those who assist people and groups affected by human rights violations (like NGOs, trade unions and other civil society actors) familiar with the rights provided for by the Charter and with methods and ways to use the Charter.

The Project is carried out by the Ludwig Boltzmann Institute of Human Rights (BIM) of Vienna (coordinator), the Institute for International Legal Studies (ISGI-CNR), the Institute for Law and Society (INPRIS) of Warsaw, and the University of Milan (Faculty of Law).

The International Conference

The Institute for International Legal Studies (ISGI - CNR) organizes an international conference that will be held in Rome, 23-24 October 2014, at the National Research Council of Italy (CNR) (P.le Aldo Moro 7, 00185 Rome), precisely with the aim of making the EU Charter of Fundamental Rights a "living instrument" and evaluating the application of CFR provisions at the European and national level.

The Conference will bring together researchers involved in the project, leading academics and experts in the field of European Union Law and protection of human rights in Europe. Working languages of the Conference will be english and italian.

The Conference will be devoted to discuss the issues concerning both the legal relevance and implementation of the Charter at the EU Level and the application of the CFR in the national legal systems of some EU member States.

A special focus issue will be dedicated to the application of the Charter provisions concerning social rights. The Final Roundtable will deal with the Charter as a legal instrument for the protection of human rights.
