

### Final Report of the Joint Bilateral Agreement CNR/SRNSFG Bilateral Programme 2022

Considering the General Agreement signed on July 16, 2018 and the joint call for the bilateral project launched on May 25, 2022;

At the deadline foreseen by the call, 18 proposals of joint research projects have been submitted to both parties.

After the evaluation step performed independently by both Parties, National Research Council of Italy (CNR) and Shota Rustaveli National Science Foundation of Georgia (SRNSFG) agreed to fund 5 joint research projects with the highest score on both sides.

Despite the large number of good proposals received, the Parties agreed on the following final ranking list of the financed proposals:


