

Science Diplomacy Workshop

"Climate Change in the Broader Mediterranean area".

Background:

Global climate changes are affecting the Mediterranean area as all other regions of the planet. Yet, the specific Med-area appears to be an important climate change hotspot due to pronounced warming and drying. This may result in a negative impact on all activities related to the Mediterranean, from its fauna and flora population, to biodiversity, pollution, food security, weather disaster risks, coastal preservation, energy...and consequently on economy and society of a broader area that is the Mediterranean itself. Those challenges shall be tackled together, as recently declared that the 42 countries of the Union for the Mediterranean, that endorsed recently a ministerial declaration that seeks to exploit the potential of research and innovation to increase the resilience of the Euro-Mediterranean region against environmental, food security and socioeconomic challenges, as well as to promote science diplomacy.

A two days workshop will host international experts to discuss the aspects and the consequences of climate change in the broader Mediterranean area, and also consider related case-studies dedicated to other regions of the planet. The workshop will cover the following aspects

Climate Change observation, modelling and foresight Impact on the sea (temperature, biodiversity, sea currents, extreme weather-"Medicanes") Impact on the coast Impact on agriculture

Timing and location:

The event will take place on 9-10 October in the premises of Bibliotheca Alexandrina, host and co-organiser, in Alexandria, Egypt.

Description of the event:

The Italian Embassy in Cairo in collaboration with Bibliotheca Alexandrina, NIOF and AASTMT, will organize the two days workshop aimed at discussing the impact and consequences of Climate Changes in the Mediterranean, to raise awareness in the civil society and the policy makers and reinforce the dialogue among the scientific community in the area. The event in presence will be in English and will be streamed online. Presentation and photo of the event will be available at the end of the works and findings of the workshop will be collected in a proceedings booklet edited by Bibliotheca Alexandrina.
