Born in Milan of Soragnese parents, he graduated summa cum laude in medicine and surgery in 1973 at the University of Milan; in 1976 he obtained the specialization in oncology at the University of Pavia. He worked in England at the Chester Beatty Research Institute in Belmont, where he deepened the studies of Robert Evans and Peter Alexander; he then worked in the United States, at the National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, and in Milan, at the Mario Negri Institute and the Humanitas Clinical Institute, of which since 2005 he has been the scientific director and president of the Humanitas Foundation for research.
